Most provinces and Territories provide online services for ordering new vital statistics documents. To save time, you can choose to have your new documents sent straight to our office, also saving on additional shipping fees.

## **Provincial Court and Judicial Offices**

To order a divorce certificate, you will need to contact the courthouse where the divorce was filed. If you know where the divorce was filed, you can send them a request in writing (remember to include the Court file number and any Court fee) with a prepaid return envelope. Fees and processing times vary depending on the Province or Territory.
